What's the *History Fund*?

- Newer grant program of the Ohio Historical Society
- Supports local and state history projects, programs, and events



The History Fund

- A Statehood Day legislative priority since 2006
- Also called "tax check off" or "competitive matching grant" program



Goals of the History Fund:

To support projects that...

- ✓ Are objective and fair
- √ Strengthen Ohio history
- ✓ Demonstrate community support
- √ Benefit the public
- ✓ Demonstrate a measurable impact
- **✓** Foster sustainability
- ✓ Meet professional standards



Who funds the History Fund?

 You—your donation of your tax refund or your gift to OHS funds the grant program

Your tax refund donations / gift to OHS + Ohio Historical Society

=History Fund grant program

Who is eligible to apply?

- Ohio-based, nonprofit organizations in good standing
- Public entities in Ohio, eg. units of local government, public libraries, and educational institutions
- Organizations operating OHS sites under site management agreements.
- Functions / fiscal responsibilities assigned to OHS under site management agreements are not eligible for History Fund grants.

OHIO HISTORICAL SOCIETY

Who's ineligible to apply?

- For-profit businesses
- Private individuals
- Ohio Historical Society
- Any of these may provide services to a grantee, but no grants will be awarded directly to these applicants.

OHIO HISTORICAL SOCIETY

What activities will the *History Fund*, fund?

Projects in 3 categories:

- 1. Organizational Development
- 2. Programs & Collections
- 3. Bricks & Mortar



What activities will the *History Fund*, fund?

ORGANIZATIONAL DEVELOPMENT

 Projects that build capacity: provide training and materials to help historical organizations help themselves



ORGANIZATIONAL DEVELOPMENT

- Grant minimum: \$1,000
- Grant maximum: \$4,000
- Project length: 1 year
- Match requirement: 80/20. The grant will pay 80% of the total cost of a project; applicant will be responsible for a 20% match.
- Funds distribution: 50% of the grant amount at the beginning of the project; remainder paid after project final report accepted.



What activities will the *History Fund*, fund?

PROGRAMS & COLLECTIONS

• Projects that further the study, interpretation, publication and dissemination of historical information, engagement of communities in history, or preservation of historical collections and archives.



PROGRAMS & COLLECTIONS

- Grant minimum: \$2,000
- Grant maximum: \$20,000
- Project length: 2 years
- Match requirement: 60/40. The grant will pay 60% of the total cost of a project; applicant will be responsible for a 40% match.
- Funds distribution: 50% of the grant amount at the beginning of the project; remainder paid after project final report accepted.



What activities will the *History Fund*, fund?

BRICKS & MORTAR

- Work on properties on National Register of Historic Places
- Work on a building used for the preservation of historical or archival collections regardless of the building's historic status.
- New construction dedicated to the preservation of historical or archival collections.



BRICKS & MORTAR

- Grant minimum: \$2,000
- Grant maximum: \$20,000
- Project length: 2 years
- Match requirement: 60/40. The grant will pay 60% of total cost of a project; applicant will be responsible for a 40% match.
- Funds distribution: 20% of grant paid at the beginning of the project. Remainder paid over life the grant on a reimbursement basis.



BRICKS & MORTAR – continued

- Bricks and Mortar projects require a maintenance agreement
- Property owner agrees to maintain the historic features of the property (for historic properties), or retain the building for its intended use (for non-historic) for five years.



Ineligible Projects – History Fund

- Acquisition of historical materials for an institution's collection.
- Buildings moving or reconstructing
- Buildings remodeling: projects to remodel or modernize building interiors unrelated to the guidelines above.
- Copyright: projects that would convert to a digital format materials that the applicant intuition does not hold the copyright to.
- Costs of operation, such as utilities, security system maintenance fees, grounds keeping hosting services for website, digital image storage, etc.

Ineligible projects – History Fund

- Public works of art that do not address Ohio history and the goals of the History Fund (see above section).
- Equipment: Purchase of equipment not related to accomplishing a specific project goal.
- Historical markers: Grants to erect or repair Ohio Historical Markers. For grants for markers, see www.remarkableohio.org
- Honoraria when the primary intent is to confer distinction.
- Insurance costs, unless shown as match for an event or program.
- Interest and debt payments.



Ineligible projects – History Fund

- Interest and debt payments.
- Direct lobbying or fundraising.
- Mitigation costs (under Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act).
- Oral history that does not focus on a particular subject or theme.
- Other activities: the list above is not comprehensive.

- July 1, 2013: Application available at www.ohiohistory.org/historyfund
- September 1: Applications due
- February 2014: Funding decisions announced
- May 2014: Project periods start (12 to 24 months)
